

Letter from the Minister

"Taste and see"

For a number of years now, Lindsay has been an Associate Tutor at Moray House, the teacher training college. This means that, as well as helping out with teaching, she visits students in placement to see how they are getting on.

Yesterday she came back from one such visit to an excellent student feeling very encouraged. He had been teaching an upper primary school class all about poetry, and had asked them the question – "What do feelings taste like?"

There were many good answers given, but the ones that impressed her most were a boy, who said 'anger' tasted like 'vinegar', and a girl who said 'joy' tasted like 'a banana – big and yellow and full of sunshine'.

I believe there is a poet in each of us. Here is an exercise to prove it. Many of the 'fruits of the Spirit' listed by Paul in his letter to the Galatians (chapter 5) are actual feelings.

So, what tastes would you associate with the



following – love, joy, & peace? And what 'tastes' would you associate with the following 'fruits of our sinful nature' – envy, jealousy, hatred, & anger?

There is a well-known saying in the Bible – *"In God's presence is fullness of joy"* (Psalm 16.11). What do you think that tastes like? Similarly, here is another saying –

"Do not let the sun go down on your anger" (Ephesians 4.6). Presumably, if you do, you will wake up with a bad taste in your mouth.

The ability to taste, of course, is one of the many wonders of creation, proving that our appreciation of God doesn't have to be limited to what we see and hear.

The Psalms are poems written in praise of God. They were also the hymnbook of the Jewish exiles in Babylon. During July and August this year we will be exploring some of them, but here is a verse from one to whet your appetite ...

Oh taste and see that the Lord is good Blessed is the one who takes refuge in him (Psalm 34.8)



St RICHARD of CHICESTER

St Richard of Chichester, who lived from 1197 to 1253, is patron saint of the English county of Sussex.

In 1244 Richard was elected Bishop of Chichester; but King Henry III wanted someone else as bishop, and he ordered that no one should feed or house Richard. So Richard lived with a friend who was a parish priest, and visited his entire diocese on foot for two years until the king relented.

Richard is widely remembered today for the prayer he is supposed to have said as he was dying. The prayer was adapted for the song 'Day by Day' in the musical 'Godspell', and it is in this form that most people know it today:

> Day by day, Dear Lord, of thee three things I pray: To see thee more clearly, Love thee more dearly, Follow thee more nearly, Day by Day.

As a family with young kids we are not abounding in sleep; but what we do have is a safe (messy) home, and a God who has challenged us to use what we have to help others. When we heard about Safe Families for Children Scotland, their vision struck a chord with us.

Helping families in crisis stay together by hosting kids so that parents can have some space to work things through is such a simple but profoundly effective strategy.



Often our family and their needs are the reason we can't volunteer at

the moment for other things – what if they could be an asset to help others?

The process for getting involved was simple and really helpful. We went to a training day which gave us a realistic picture of the needs facing struggling families in Edinburgh and the Lothians, and space to ask a lot of questions about what a Host Family was. We then had a visit from a staff member who took time to get to know all of us as a family and find out how we could work with them.

We have since had a long term match made with a local family who we help every second weekend. We have the option to opt in for other short term or one off emergencies which match with our availability; but for now, developing this relationship has been special for us.as we find our feet as hosts.

It's lovely to be serving as a family together, with our kids doing as much as us to build this child's confidence and give them new experiences, as a wee break from quite a challenging norm for them. Giggles from the play-tent, first time at the zoo staring at the tiger, and getting very muddy are standout memories!

We feel very supported by Safe Families, and would love to chat to you if this is something you are considering!


