Letter from the Minister February - Focus Day Feedback

I've just got back from our congregational 'Focus Day' (morning, actually, and finishing with a lovely bread and soup lunch), when we spent some time together reflecting on this year's theme -

"We have this treasure in jars of clay" (2 Corinthians 4.7).

Our guest speaker was Rev Maggie Lane, who, in the early 'noughties' spent six months with us as she explored her own calling to ministry. This was something she eventually and reluctantly accepted, and for a number of years now she has been the leader of one of the churches at Kirkliston.

Maggie talked of her own feelings of inadequacy before taking on the role of minister, and this led us all to reflect on how God uses even us, broken as we are, to help others know that there is hope in Jesus, and that a new life is possible.

While we need to acknowledge that there may well be suffering along the way, it is often when we go through hard times that



we can look back and see how Jesus has helped us, and we can then support others going through similar struggles.

Maggie also spoke of the need for honesty and humility in our relationship with God, and especially in our prayer life. She centred on the need for God's transforming presence in the life of our church, quoting the well-known promise he gives us in 2 Chronicles 7.14 -

> "If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land."

Towards the end of the morning we spent some time sharing what we felt God had been saying to us as a church. The main themes that emerged in common were

- the importance of meeting together in prayer
- our need for humility in the presence of God
- our need to accept our brokenness before God's light can shine through

Faith Story from Karen & Brian Watts

As a child, church was a place full of tall, solemn men in black suits – both frightening and dull. I was confirmed at school and enthused by the bible and stories of Jesus but it didn't translate to a living faith. It was all-too-easy to drift off and enjoy the distractions of life.

Parenthood was the tipping point, a wonderful but painful experience for both of us and in the middle of it a re-found belief in God for me and the start of Brian's journey to meet him.



We plunged from the dizzy heights, when Andrew was born, to the darkest depths, losing our second baby late in pregnancy. The profound realisation that, as parents, all we could do was hand our wee one back to God brought us back to church and the knowledge there is always hope and you're never alone.

A large haemorrhage had me hospitalised for three months, thinking we'd lost, then hoping for the safe arrival of our youngest. Both John and Susan Duncan regularly sat and prayed with me. I found a real sense of inner peace and calm and, with it the patience, to lie and wait. The answered prayers gifted us with a healthy baby (Euan) and family unity again.

As life settled I attended one of the first Alpha courses which really made me think and challenged what I understood about God and my Faith.

My approach to life changed and I didn't rely on myself anymore, find myself saying "it's not about me but you!". There was suddenly nothing to be scared about.

Liberton Kirk became a huge and very important part of our lives as we brought up our boys, and we've been surrounded by a tremendously supportive and loving church family as we've faced the various hurdles along the way. Now, as we take that next step to blend our lives between Edinburgh and Ireland (where Brian is working) we know that God has a bigger plan for us.

We feel so lucky and blessed!

Poppies - WWI - 1918-2018

This year marks the centenary of the end of the Great War. Liberton Kirk would like to commemorate the event in a very special way for which we need **your** help.

For 11th November 2018 we would like to create a cross of poppies mounted on the Kirk tower, an iconic landmark in the south of the city, with a veil of poppies flowing to the ground. They will be visible for miles around. Not just any poppies; but particularly red poppies which you have made –knitted, crocheted, sewn from felt, fabric, plastic, ceramic, metal – whatever you can do.

They can be any size, with or without a leaf. A safety pin at the back would be helpful if that is possible. There are many templates on the web and we shall have printed templates available soon if you need a hand.

Liberton is well known for it's outreach policy, so can you go one step further? If you belong to a group of any description ask your friends, family, neighbours, colleagues to join in and make some too. Does anyone have contacts overseas who can spread the word? It would be lovely to see poppies arriving from all over the world.

Some people would perhaps like to attach a name to the poppy in memory of someone who fought for our country and these names will be kept. If you have a story of someone, or an event and would like to put it on one side of an A4 sheet these will also be put into a folder in the Kirk for all to see.

Can we aim for about 8000 poppies. Start now and we *could* achieve that. Poppies can be handed from now until the end of September into the café at the Kirk Centre. I have made 1 felt poppy, only 7999 to go. HELP. I have faith in your abilities to do this and make the centenary one to remember.
