



#### Youth news from Kenny

Are you wondering what the youth workers have been up to?

The run-up to Easter gives us an opportunity to spend LOADS of quality time in the local schools, where we get to share about Christ in creative ways. For a start, take the assemblies:

With **Gracemount Primary School**, it's straightforward - we're invited to tell all the pupils what Easter is all about. Ten pupils were invited to act out scripted events which might earn them discipline, but Emily would jump in and take their punishment for them! It's funny, and some of the kids really enjoy being at the front. It is when we get to tell the Easter story, and what Jesus did for them, that makes the whole exercise is worth it.

The two Secondary schools are a bit different - we're assigned values to inspire in the pupils so we have to link it with a clear message of Easter. At **Gracemount**, we managed to link the value of Optimism (the story of Colonel Sanders' optimism in founding KFC) with the hope found in the Easter story of Jesus rising from the dead. *Imagine that* - KFC and Jesus!

At **Liberton**, Paul Friend and I linked Easter to the assigned value of "caring for each other" through the sacrificial story of *Elisaveto "Mother Maria" Pilenko*, and it culminates in the powerful comparison of Jesus laying down his life for his friends, only to rise again.

Opt-in services were held too, and at Liberton High and we are glad to report that 19 pupils chose to come in for a wonderful service together, and consider what Jesus means for them personally.

You might know that where I grew up, the local Christian youth worker is not permitted on public school grounds, let alone have a discussion about the Gospel message. So I'm incredibly thankful that our community is warmly open - let's pray together that this continues, and that our relationships within the schools deepen; but mainly that God might do a mighty work and bring young people into a faithful relationship with him.

#### WWI Poppies for Liberton

If everyone made 10 poppies we would have a fantastic display to commemorate all who served in WW1.

Not impossible, because some kind people are setting themselves a target, such as a square yard of poppies, 100 poppies, a poppy for every child in my extended family etc.

Easy knit pattern – size 6 needles, 52 stitches dk wool, 8 rows 2pl 2purl rib, k 2 tog for 3 rows, run wool through and sew up. Add something black in the middle and wire tie, safety pin, strong thread etc. on the back to attach to the netting. Done in 20 minutes.

**Easy fabric poppy** – use a coaster for a template, cut round, add black centre etc. 10 completed in 30 mins. The church office has felt for sale.

Our current total is **702** and we have a generous donation from an elderly member to buy more felt!

#### Faith Story from Kim Denholm

My journey to faith took a long time. I don't really have any 'Eureka' moments but looking back, see lots of experiences and encounters that led me to where I am now.

I grew up in a non-churchgoing home but attended Gilmerton Primary in the days of Mr Hoddinott with weekly traditional Christian assemblies by Rev Skinner. I still smile in Kirk today when a 'school' hymn is sung!

While teaching in Burdiehouse, I decided to undertake local history with my class.

Burdiehouse had lime kilns, Gilmerton a Cove and Liberton, well it has a Kirk so I emailed John Young to ask if we could visit. From then, my awareness of the Kirk increased a lot: I would look at the website, kept a Sunflower pack and visited again to pilot the new school tour. I was interested but not ready although I knew deep down that if I was ever going to go to a church, it was going to be Liberton.

Not long before I contacted John, I became friendly with a Liberton couple, John and Barbara Jamieson. After Barbara died, John would come for lunch, garden centre visits and dog walks. He often mentioned the Kirk but I resisted, largely due to a voluntary job 3 nights a week. Sunday was the only day I had to catch up on things. I noticed the Alpha banner from time to time, thought about it, but got no further.

John died in 2013 and the one thing that shines out from that horrible time was how supportive John Young and Ray Bain were, visiting him and praying. After his funeral, I attended a Sunday service, liked it and really meant to return but things got in the way until the December memorial service. Over the next couple of weeks I seemed to drive along Kirk Brae a lot and the Alpha banner kept catching my eye. With a week left before it began, I emailed John to ask if there was space, and with the promise that I didn't have to get involved in group discussion (my pet hate!) I attended. I liked Alpha, learned a lot but still felt a little unsure - right until the very end. That last week coincided with Mum being hospitalised with a heart attack. Alone in the waiting room, I picked up a Bible that opened at Psalms and suddenly felt a real comfort that stripped away my last doubts.

I'm grateful for each encounter on my journey so far, for the patience of those who have helped me (and still do) and thankful for what I have gained in finding my faith. Kim





## 'Come, let us praise the LORD! Let us come before him with thanksgiving .... For the LORD is a mighty God, a mighty king over all the gods.' Psalm 95 verses 1-3

As we move through 2018 we lift our eyes Upward to the LORD our God, the Mighty King, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

We are encouraged to spend time with Him each and every day, to 'read the Bible, pray every day' seeking to become more like Jesus as we open up to the Holy Spirit at work in us.

During May we will visit various parts of the Bible and pray together as we consider the *Thy Kingdom Come* prayer venture across the world, the work of *Christian Aid*, *Pentecost*, the Church of Scotland annual *Assembly* and the work of *TEAR Fund*.

The Devotions are but one way to feed on God's Word in the morning, at midday, in the evening... to pray with Him continually through your day and to share with others the treasures or hurdles you discover. The Church website and Facebook page (even on a handy mobile) provide a fuller daily devotional page. However it all follows the pattern below which the information overleaf fits into, based on the Kirk's origins of the Celtic and Northumbrian traditions.

#### Morning

Reading and Meditation on the theme Prayer of response to the Word

Midday

Prayer – mostly for others **Evening** 

Verse(s) from the morning reading Reflection on the day

Prayer
