

May we carry your light to the people we meet and bring your peace and hope to those living in fear.


Lord Jesus, there will be no end to the increase of your government and peace.

I've been a chaplain to Gracemount High School since 1996, and I've seen a lot of changes in the last 24 years; but nothing has compared to what we are all going through just now.

The Coronavirus crisis is not just affecting us, or our community, it is affecting the whole world. We don't know when it will end, and we don't know what the world will look like when it does.

This year, because the schools closed early, the chaplains were not able to take our usual Easter Assemblies, and so, instead, I was asked to record a brief message for the Cracemount High School community.

In the film I suggested that we all focus on the things that really matter, such as ...

- the things that we often take for granted, like our health, and our loved ones and the community of which we are a part,
- the need to stay safe, which means acknowledging that we cannot manage this on our own, and we need to look after each other
- And finally, (and this had something of an Easter ring to it), the need for sacrifice – for giving up doing the things we like doing, for the sake of the well-being of others.



One of Jesus most challenging teachings is this...

'Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will save it. What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, and yet lose or forfeit their very self?'

(Luke 9.23-5)

The events we are living through just now will be talked about for years to come. So, here's a thought to finish with. When the day come when we find ourselves in conversation with someone who was too young to remember the coronavirus crisis, or who was born after it is all over, and they ask us questions like ...

"What was it like?" and What did you do to help others get through it?",

what answer will we give them?

My hope and prayer is that we will all have lots to say.


















# Faith Story from Francis Watts

I count it a blessing to have be born into a Christian family and you could say *My Faith Journey* started the day I was born. Both my parents came from large families and both sides were staunch members of The Salvation Army from its earliest days.

My parents and three of their siblings became Officers (Ministers) in that "Army". My parents' early postings took us to the slums and areas still left derelict from the bombing of WW2.

Here we lived alongside the people my parents worked with, and here I learnt some early lessons about Christian faith and practice: that God was already there when we arrived and met our needs in many ways; that preaching the Gospel by your deeds was every bit as powerful as a sermon; that living in a close community could be very supportive, but you also need time to be alone. In those places I saw many lives transformed when people responded to Jesus. But, like many before me.


I drifted away from the church in my late teens. Lyn and I married in 1977 and a year later recommitted ourselves to the Lord. In 1980 we started fulltime Ministry with The Salvation Army. So began some thirty years of following the path God had planned for us.







Verse(s) from the morning reading Reflection and Prayer at end of the day






