The secret of growing younger

I was listening to a stand-up comedian on the radio last week and he was talking about growing older. He said the moment you realise you've become an adult is when you see a bunch of people younger than you and you catch yourself thinking 'Oh no! YOUTHS!'

I remember when, a few years ago, Andy Chittick gave us a talk on the best way to engage younger people in the life of the church. He outlined the four steps we need to take –

1) Meet them where $\underline{\text{they}}$ are on $\underline{\text{their}}$ terms

2) Meet them where <u>they</u> are on <u>your</u> terms

3) Meet them where \underline{you} are on their terms

4) Meet them where <u>you</u> are on <u>your</u> terms

Of course at the heart of this strategy is the need to build a good relationship with a younger person, before you can expect them to want to be involved in something you are doing.

For the last year, here at Liberton, we have been involved in a programme called 'Growing Young', and in April the many leaders of our congregation met together for our six monthly 'Internal Learning Community', to review how we were getting on. Towards the end, Emily, our Youth & Children's Worker, made an important point.

If you want more young people to be involved in something you are planning for the church, please don't ask me to bring them along to you. Instead you need to go to where they are and join in with what **they are doing** so that they can get to know you better. If they come to see you as someone they know and trust, then they will be much more likely to get on board with what **you are doing**."

Of course, even in adulthood, there are lots of different 'generations', distinguished not just by their age, but by things like their social habits and musical tastes. 'Growing Young' is not so much about us all becoming like teenagers, but rather about us relating better to anyone of any generation younger than our own, and, if you follow the logic of what Emily said, that means spending more time with people of different ages.

If we persevere at this, then, over time we will become more and more like the Spirit-filled church spoken of by the Apostle Peter on the day of Pentecost – a place where... *"our folks will dream dreams and our younger folks will have visions" (Joel* 2.28), and where people of every generation will be valued, included, and their voices heard. What a lovely thought!



When Peace Like a River

In 1873, Horatio Spafford planned a trip to Europe with his wife and four daughters. He was detained at the last minute by a business matter, and was unable to accompany his wife and family on the Ville du Havre when it sailed from New York. During the voyage there was a collision with another ship, the Loch Earn, and the Ville du Havre sank in a short time.

Despite the efforts of the sailors, all four daughters were lost. When Mrs Spafford reached land, she sent her husband the famous telegram containing the words "Saved Alone". When Horatio Spafford sailed for Europe, the captain called him on deck to say that the ship was at the point where his daughters were lost. He went to his cabin and composed the words of the famous hymn.

The music was composed by Philip P. Bliss, who wrote the words and music for many gospel hymns; for example, "Let the Lower Lights be Burning". "When Peace Like a River" was first sung on November 24, 1876. Only a month later, Philip Bliss and his wife were killed in a railway accident. The hymn has had a revival in popularity and appears in many hymn books. It has been played at several care home services in the Liberton area.

Eco Church What do you actually do?

The answer would appear to be 'nothing'! I asked this question last month with regard to eco conservation and the response was overwhelmingly NOTHING.

Climate change can be aided by every single one of us playing our part. Reduce, reuse and recycle.

Let us start with a currently most pressing issue in the church halls. It is a privilege to use the halls, not a right, particularly for organisations who have the premises for free. We are not a commercially run organisation so there are no fairies to tidy up when you have gone, no fairies to sort out the rubbish you leave behind – and that rubbish is frequently dumped in the nearest receptacle, unsorted. We have bins for recycling so which fairy is going to sort out your rubbish and put paper in one bin and food in another etc. when you can't be bothered to do it yourself. Somebody has to go through what you have left behind, unsorted, to stop contaminating the various bins. Just putting everything into a black bag and leaving it is not going to solve any problems either. The binmen just reject bins that don't have the correct contents.

Would all hall users **<u>please</u>**, if at all possible, take their rubbish home for recycling. If that is not possible, please have the decency to put it in the right bins. This is nothing new so should come as second nature if you have a conscience.

Young people have largely been leading the drive to reduce reuse and recycle. Demonstrations, marches, strikes are fine for attracting attention but what is the point if you don't actually do what you are protesting about?

Sad thing is, realistically - very few young people will read this as it is not on their phone, so it is up to us 'recycled teenagers' readers to tell them. Please do and act on it yourself. Reduce reuse and recycle in the church halls as well as in your daily life.

Challenge to make a difference

A litter pick costs about £5 online. Can you adopt a small area to litter pick regularly? If you are willing to help we can make a map and show the areas where we are making Liberton a better environment for our wildlife as well as ourselves. Try to get anyone in the area to be involved. I hereby promise to pick up the rubbish that is frequently dumped in the graveyard along the Kirkgate. What area can you do?

The Bible Course:

Understanding of our place in the Story

The Bible is a library of books that tell the story of God's action in the world and among his People. It has a lot of different *kinds* of books, like history, prophecy, poetry, letters and the weird world of apocalyptic. Yet it has an underlying story line from Genesis to Revelation that is often overlooked because we focus on little bits of the text at a time. The Bible Society has produced a video-based course to help us not only understand the Big Story, but *our place in the Story*. This is not a narrative that has ended yet, and each of us must play out characters in it.

As part of Liberton Kirk's 'Good News: A Time to Plant,' we are engaging in a 'Whole Church Study' when themes from *The Bible Course* will be used in the sermon on Sundays and be the discussion theme for the week following, both online and in Link Groups (see inset). I am going to lead the course on **Monday nights from 2rd May to 13^{rh} June on Zoom, 7.30pm – 9pm**, and on each evening there will be a video with discussion questions to follow. If you would like to take part, **please make sure that you are on Gary Ross's email list** and in due course, emails will be sent round with the Zoom link.

There are resources that have been written to accompany the course and although they are not necessary to participate, some people and groups would find them useful as additional material.

The Bible: A Story That Makes Sense of Life is a book written by Andrew Ollerton, the author of the course. It is available at Church and online from Amazon and elsewhere at around $\pounds 10$.

The Bible Course Manual costs around £5. It would be especially useful for leaders of Link groups but also for guiding anyone through the themes. These will be bulk ordered from The Bible Society and details of how to reserve a copy for yourself will be put in the Notice Sheet.

Everyone is welcome to join us online to learn more about the Big Story and to explore our own role within it.


