#### Be on the look out for wayside inns

How would you define a good meal out?

In my experience, there are certain basics that an establishment has to get right for this to happen. These are things such as good food and good quality service. In addition, however, for a really good quality experience, you have to take into account less tangible things such as a good welcome, a good atmosphere, and a feeling of being valued.

I say this because one of my favourite images of a church on Sunday is that of 'a wayside inn'. A place where weary travellers in the journey of life can stop off for spiritual nourishment in some good company. A place where they can compare notes about the road they've been travelling, and learn something about what might lie ahead.

These days I sometimes catch myself stopping and marvelling at the fact that we've just emerged from a worldwide pandemic, and that, a couple of summers ago, holidays were regularly being postponed or cancelled and stay-cations were as much as we could all hope for. This summer, however, it is almost back to 'normal' and very likely that many of us will soon be heading off to far flung destinations on various modes of transport.

If this means you, then I know that God will be with you as you travel, and will be using you to spread the light of his love. Could I encourage you, also, wherever you go, to be on the lookout for a good wayside inn. Somewhere to top up your spiritual energy levels, and, by your very presence, bring encouragement to your fellow worshippers by reminding them that they, too, are part of a worldwide movement of people following in the footsteps of Jesus.

In the same way, could I encourage those of us who will be attending our local 'wayside inn', to be on the lookout for strangers in our midst - people who may be hoping for a 'good meal out'. Make sure they get a good welcome, good service, and are valued and encouraged. Make sure, too, that they are given the best seats, both in church and across in the café afterwards.

#### Telling Others the Good News'

Tim Keller says that deconstructing "defeater beliefs" held by unbelievers is vital for evangelism in secular cultures. "Every culture hostile to Christianity holds to a set of 'common sense' consensus beliefs that automatically make Christianity seem implausible to people. These are what philosophers call 'defeater beliefs.'" (see Footnote 1)

If a person holds the belief that humans cannot know anything about God, that person is not likely to believe anything we tell him about God. In this regard, defeater beliefs are obstacles that need to be removed - by the power of the Word and the Spirit (and our patience and courage).

But let's pivot from the unbeliever to ourselves for a moment. In general, whom do you most frequently speak to? Your partner? Your best mate? For most of us, the correct answer is ourselves! All day long, we are speaking to ourselves. What beliefs are we reciting to ourselves that prevent us from starting conversations with the lost? I might hold a defeater belief, "She won't be interested in anything spiritual," or "He will not want to read the Bible with me." These defeater beliefs of ours are weeds to be pulled.

Let's ask the Holy Spirit to identify a few of our defeater beliefs that prevent us from inviting others into discipleship conversations with us. Remember that it is the God of truth, the God who loves us, who gives us the command to make disciples. He is willing to transform our minds (Rom. 12:2) to make us fruitful disciple makers in 21st-century Scotland. Let's not be discouraged. We are on this journey together!

#### Updates, from some of our mission partners

#### ... from our Family Partner in Kenya

Fidelis and Nelson returned recently from their biannual trip to Embu and a visit to Rutune village, where they were warmly welcomed. Those they encountered were keen to hear about Liberton Kirk and expressed their gratitude for our support and prayers. It had been a very dry period with no rains since last year, so everyone was praying for the blessing of rain. During their last visit to the village and a week before their travel back, the rains did come, so everyone got very busy planting maize and beans as well as tatties.

#### ...- from Mediterranean Hope in Italy



Fiona Kendall recently shared a meal of Afghani

dishes cooked by refugees in an Italian Methodist Church in Rome. The refugees participating had arrived in Italy during the past eight months, thanks to the humanitarian corridors programme, managed by the Federation of Protestant Churches in Italy. Two young women spoke of their terror as they crossed into Pakistan unaccompanied. Another woman had heard of people trying to cross the Mediterranean Sea in



small boats, at risk to their own lives. 'We', she said, 'have had the simple route, coming via humanitarian corridors. How grateful we are'.

#### ..... from Comfort International, working in Central Africa

Land and buildings have been acquired for a vocational training centre in the Democratic Republic of Congo. According to Comfort International, 'Wars, insecurity, land conflicts, ethnic conflicts and human rights violations have robbed young people

of their hope.' The area of Rutshuro in particular has experienced atrocities for over

20 years, forcing people to flee to people camps in neighbouring cities. Children under 17 years of age are forcibly required to join armed groups. We pray that this training centre will offer many a way out, with skills in masonry, carpentry, brickbuilding, sewing and literacy being offered, as well as strategies to cope with civilian life. The centre will also link young people with professionals and provide chaplaincy and discipleship.

# Eco-Congregation Programme:

#### Spiritual Living, Practical Action and Global Responsibility

Last year, Liberton Kirk joined a network of over 600 congregations across Scotland in registering with the Eco-Congregation programme, www.ecocongregationscotland.org

What is Eco-Congregation? Eco-Congregation is an international ecumenical programme which assists churches in making the link between environmental issues and the Christian faith, helping them to act in practical ways as individuals, as congregations, and in communities locally and globally. The programme has three main themes:

- Spiritual living: helping congregations to see the connection between faith and environmental concerns;
- Practical action: encouraging action on energy use and recycling for individuals and in church buildings; promoting biodiversity in church grounds and gardens;
- Global living: supporting local, national and global environmental initiatives and fair trade organisations.

What have we done so far? The initial step for a congregation registering for Eco-Congregation is to undertake a structured church environmental check-up. This covers twelve areas of activity covered by the three main themes listed above, allowing churches to identify current strengths and areas where further action could be taken. We have recently completed the check-up at Liberton Kirk.

What next for Eco-Congregation at Liberton Kirk? The next step is to develop an action plan which addresses the key points identified in the environmental check-up. Once these actions have been completed, there would then be the optional opportunity to apply for an Eco-Congregation award. This accolade is available at bronze, silver or gold levels, corresponding to the quality and depth of the activities recorded, and provides independent recognition of a congregation's achievements.
