

Travelling Well

Like Lindsay and I, you may have had the chance to watch the 'real life' television documentary which was screened during the Easter season called 'The Pilgrimage'.

It follows a group of celebrities as they walk together through the beautiful North Wales countryside on their way to Bardsey Island. At first sight they appear to be a disparate bunch of people from different backgrounds and faith traditions, but what they all seem to share in common is a sort of 'wistfulness' – a hope that they are going to be changed by the pilgrim experience.

In the very first episode I was struck by one of the participants in particular, who made it very clear on several occasions that she had no time for what she labelled as 'organised religion'. The irony of her saying this was that, by going on a pilgrimage, this was exactly what she was so happily participating in.

Jesus doesn't call us to be part of an organisation, he simply says 'Come and follow mel' And, in time, his disparate bunch of followers, journeying together in the company of the Master, came to be known, collectively, as 'the church'. And, as the above mentioned TV program aptly demonstrates, when you spend time walking with others, and stopping off at various places to talk about the deeper things of life, you learn about and experience things you would never experience on your own.

Looking back over the years, this has been something we've experienced here at Liberton. Back in 2015 a bunch of us did this when we went on a pilgrimage to Lindisfarne. Every year, it is something that is seen over and over again by those who participate in the Good Friday prayer walk to Morrisons, and on the trek up to the top of the Braids for the dawn service on Easter morning.

And all year round, for those who love the challenge of outdoor exercise, there is the companionship offered by the 'Liberton Trotters' and the cycling group, while for those for whom this is now too much of a challenge, there is the joy of being part of a Link Group, or of volunteering together in things like the Kirkgate Café, or the Gardening Group.

When Jesus sent out his first disciples two by two, he did this for a reason. We learn along the way and more so as we share our experiences with each other. So, as our Spring slowly heads into our Summer, here's a challenge for us all.

When it comes to learning about your faith and putting it into practice, who



are you walking with?

May people who meet us ask, "What does this mean?"





Are you someone on the rota to read the lessons, or lead the prayers in Church on Sundays? Or would you like to do this, but are not sure what it involves?



Duke of Edinburgh appointed as Lord High Commissioner

Prince Edward, the Duke of Edinburgh, has been appointed as the Lord High Commissioner to the 2024 General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, a decade after he last took on the role of royal representative at the annual gathering.

The Lord High Commissioner is the Sovereign's personal representative to the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland and is appointed by His Majesty the King to attend proceedings on his behalf. The Duke of Edinburgh is also expected to participate in other events and functions while visiting the capital.

Prince Edward was previously Lord High Commissioner in 2014, when he held the title of Earl of Wessex, and represented his mother, the late Queen.

Nature and science meet faith in stunning new Baptist-led films

"The God Saw That It Was Good films take people deeper in the wonder and mystery of the world. They enable viewers to encounter the wonder,




