

Safe and Secure

Have you noticed that the term 'security' can mean different things in different contexts?

My daughter once told me of a time when she was working as an archaeologist for a firm tasked with inspecting a site cleared for building work in inner city Glasgow. She and her colleague had just parked their car when they were engaged in conversation by a couple of very young and enterprising local lads.

The lads were very interested in what was going on, what the site was for, and what their role was in clearing it for development. One of them then glanced very pointedly at their car and said, "Is that your car then?"

"Yes it is", my daughter replied.
"So", said the young lad, "you'll be needing some security then?"

We live in a world where 'security' is packaged in different shapes and sizes. Our job security is guaranteed by our job contract. Our buildings, possessions, health and travel are covered by insurance agreements, and our retirement is covered by our pension plans. There is even room, on occasion, for enterprising people of whatever age to come up with ad hoc schemes to 'protect' our cars from the threat of vandalism.

Where does your security lie? We

live in an increasingly insecure age, where there are, and will be, pandemics, wars, and natural disasters, and where the security offered by the world is likely to prove less and less adequate for our needs.

My experience has shown me that, when all is said and done, the best place to find security is in the promises of God. Listen to these word of Jesus...

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life? ...But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. (Matthew 5.25-27; 33)

Real and lasting security lies in the knowledge that God loves us and will always be there for us. Knowing this can set us free to be God's children living the life we were created to live.

Ready for Service: Cammy MacKenzie

At the risk of showing my age, (currently 64 years and about 33,days,) I wonder if any of you remember Candid Camera? It was a comedy programme from the 60s and early 70s which played tricks on unsuspecting members of the public. If you are blessed and do not remember it then let google lead you to a treasure trove of delights......

One skit above the hundreds I likely watched as a child sticks in my mind. They had a team of guys push a small car up to about 25 miles an hour or so and then let it freewheel from just outside a mechanics workshop. The driver ran the car into the guy's bay, pulls on the handbrake and tells the mechanic" I am having some issues with my car, is there any chance you could have a look at it and perhaps give it a service please? The mechanic then lifts the bonnet of the car only to find there is no engine!!! As a child and an adult I am still grinning to think of that mechanic's face as he scratched his head trying to figure out what was going on......

I was asked to write a little piece titled READY TO SERVE for the good folk of Liberton Kirk and so I want to use this small space to let you know what I think it means to be "ready to serve"......

From the day I became a Christian back in July 1987 I immediately began to serve in my local Church called St.Ninian's in Paisley. t was not a difficult choice for me to give up time in my week, nor to lose income in my desire to serve the Lord of Glory by turning up for duty at various points through the week.

I began by driving the Church Minibus and it grew from there to include visiting the housebound, turning up morning and evening to shift chairs, going along to the BB to cut the children's hair and donating the cash for BB funds. Gradually this grew and included giving up work to study at both school and college to prepare for the full time university course that would lead to my becoming either a missionary or an ordained minister.

Perhaps then, I am the wrong person to ask to write this piece as it came so "easy" to me. It must be said I was a single man with no mortgage, not much in the way of bills to pay and perhaps I had it easy whilst others have families to support which I did not. Either way there are three things I want to leave with you before I let you go....

A. If it's good enough for Christ, it's good enough for me.

In Mark 10 v 45 Jesus says this of Himself" the son of man came not to be served but to serve. If Jesus came to teach us anything, it is that the purpose of our lives from day one in our faith is Service. That service will take different forms for different people but it is essential that we report for duty just like Jesus did.

B. Service is an obligation not a suggestion.

2 Corinthians 5 v 15 tells me all I need to know about this. "He died for all and those who live should no longer live for themselves but for Him who died for them and was raised again. It is our great King who commands our service and I for one do not want to be found AWOI.....



C. There is Blessing for those who do as Christ bids.....

Matthew 10 v 42. And whoever gives even as much as a cold cup of water to one of these will not lose their reward. We are surrounded by people and organisations that need our service. Without our input work that would have been accomplished perishes on the vine. We cannot do everything but barring age or infirmity we mostly can do something.

One of the toughest things that I do every month is to go out on patrol as a street pastor walking the city centre streets till the wee small hours in all weathers. It makes me really tired and last week I was feeling lousy and really didn't feel like it but I went as the team could not have gone out without me. But I was so glad I did as we were able to serve some of the most vulnerable and also touch base with and have conversations with young people from all over this country and abroad. I was knackered on Saturday but it was worth it.

To close I want to take you back to Candid Camera. The TV viewers were always watching. They were always in on the joke. They saw the puzzled, confused looks on the faces on those who got pranked. Without wanting to make God our Father seem like a voyeur, He is watching us live our lives and every single time she sees us do something for His a Kingdom, for His people, for His World we make Him smile.

God bless you all in His Service. Cammy MacKenzie

Money Matters

2023 Accounts

The signed and audited accounts for 2023 are now available on the side cupboards in the Church (in the 'Money Matters' display rack).

For further information, and in the same place, there is also a sheet with two tables (one each side) showing an analysis of the figures on page 6 of the accounts.

One relates to Unrestricted Funds – the most important one being the General Fund (see below). This analysis shows our offerings as well as the costs of our staff and other expenses incurred in the running and maintenance of our Church, the halls and the activities which are held in them.

The second analysis is a breakdown of the income and expenditure of the Restricted Funds (for which a specific purpose has been stated by the donor).

General Fund

In 2023 offerings (including gift aid tax reclaimed) rose by £9,000 when compared to 2022. Income from Hall use has also increased by £7,000 over the previous year. Grants of £1,000 was received in relation to the Warm Hub running on Friday afternoons in the foyer.

The 'Giving to Grow' contribution (previously 'Ministries and Mission') to '121' was significantly higher than previously and the total cost of salaries to locally paid staff has has also increased due to there being two additional members of staff to cover more hours when the halls are open and in view of the increased use of our facilities. The increase in the expenditure was £22,000 overall.

It is encouraging, however, that the General Fund had a surplus of £12,500 which has been transferred to Reserves to meet future deficits.

Kirkgate Cafe

The cafe has done well in 2023 and has catered for a number of private events. The flooring in the foyer has been replaced and this was charged equally to the cafe and church funds. Despite this cost the cafe made a small surplus for the year.

Other Funds

The major problem of water ingress into the church building is being addressed – this is being funded from part of the legacy received from Christine Seaton previously. While some of the costs of the scaffolding and the stonework have been met in 2023



the majority of the expense will be incurred in 2024 as more of the stonework damage is addressed.

The year ahead - 2023

By the time you read this Liberton Kirk will have become part of a union with Liberton Northfield, Gracemount and Tron Kirk (Gilmerton and Moredun) – date of union: 31 March 2024.

Although we are united as one new parish of South East Edinburgh Church of Scotland (SEECOS) there will remain a worshipping community in each of the church buildings and the daily activities, both in the churches and halls, will continue as before. It is hoped that all members of the new parish will embrace the change and support the new parish, both financially and spiritually, as we go forward into an exciting new era.


Treasurer's Note


