#### How best to measure love

What is the worst thing you would be willing to forgive?

Just over a year ago my son, Liam, and daughter-in-law, Fi, were all set to go off on a much longed for and well deserved holiday abroad. The flights were booked, the bags were packed, and all that was left was a few last minute details to arrange.

Part of their planning had involved where to leave their much loved dog – a one year old miniature schnauzer called 'Zadok' (yes, that's right – named after 'Zadok the Priest'). Arrangements had been made to leave him at the home of close friends, where he would be reunited with one of his favourite older brothers from the same parents.

The only problem was that young Zadok had sensed that change was in the air, and was a bit on edge as a result. Liam told me afterwards that they had only left the room for a matter of minutes, but when he returned he found his passport, (which had been placed safely on a shelf high above the couch), lying on the floor and looking rather chewed and battered, with half his photo missing, and Zadok looking a bit guilty. Sadly, when they contacted the passport office, they discovered it was too late to get a substitute in time, and so the holiday had to be cancelled.

Did they forgive him? Of course they did! He was just a dog, and he didn't really know what he was doing, or did he? And besides, they still loved him to bits.

All of which brings us back to the heading for this reflection – *'how best to measure love'.* Because, on a more serious note, Zadok's misdemeanors, and Liam's grace reminded me of some famous words which were once uttered from a cross – words which come to mind if I ever begin to doubt how much Cod loves me.

#### "Father, forgive them, they don't know what they are doing." (Luke 23.34)

The best way to measure someone's love for you is by asking how much they are willing to forgive. And in God's case there is no sin too great, because his forgiveness cost him a lot more than a holiday abroad.

# An introduction to the Old Testament Book of Ruth

The book of Ruth is a story of God's grace operating in difficult circumstances, during the period of the Judges. It unfolds as a four-act drama, telling the story of how Naomi, her husband and two sons left Judah for Moab, where her sons married. When Naomi's husband and sons died, she returns to Bethlehem in Judah.

In the first act, Naomi tells her Moabite daughters-in-law, Orpah and Ruth, to stay in Moab. However, Ruth refuses to leave Naomi and accompanies her to Bethlehem (chapter 1). In the next act Ruth meets Boaz, a relative of Naomi, while gathering barley in his fields (chapter 2).

The third act takes place at the threshing floor where Boaz is asleep and Ruth lies at his feet. She expresses her desire to marry him, as her kinsmanredeemer. But Boaz tells her of another prior claim (chapter 3). Finally, at the city gate, the other relative renounces his claim, and Boaz marries Ruth (chapter 4).

In Ruth's story we see God's unseen hand directing the lives of the characters to accomplish his purpose e.g. *'Naomi returned from Moab accompanied by Ruth, arriving in Bethlehem as the barley harvest was beginning'* (1:22). He transforms Naomi's sorrow into joy, rewarding Ruth with a place of honour in Israel's history. In Boaz, we see a foreshadowing of the work of Jesus Christ, as he pays the price to secure Ruth's future.

*'In its artful telling of this 'outsider' widow, uprooted and obscure, who turns out to be the great-grandmother of David and the ancestor of Jesus, the book of Ruth makes it possible for each of us to understand ourselves, however ordinary, as irreplaceable in the full telling of Cod's story.* (Eugene Peterson). ## Bird Watching is good for you !

So says a new study out of North Carolina State University. It goes on to say that watching birds is even more beneficial to us than watching other forms of wildlife.

The new study found that birdwatchers' recorded 'distress' levels dropped by 13.7 per cent, compared to that of nature-walkers' at 6.9 per cent.

The study suggests that the reason may be that birds provide their own narrative and sense of drama, which can be enough to lift someone watching them out of the everyday.

The author and presenter Kate Humble agrees. "There is something reassuring about life continuing and nature just getting on with it, even if it feels like the rest of the world is falling to bits. Birdwatching makes me feel part of a bigger, richer, beautiful picture."

"Birds give me an excuse to explore and find some solitude and calmness away from the bustle of life," says James Lowen, author of *52 Wildlife Weekends.*
