

Lord, fill our hearts with a thirst to share the message about Jesus, Your Son, Our Messiah.




Fill us with the passion of the early church, to bring the message of salvation to the world.

We are the Church together!

I am the Church! You are the Church! We are the Church together!

I love these words from the chorus of the well-known hymn! Especially at the moment, during our period of vacancy at Liberton Kirk, they remind us that each and every one of us has a part to play in the life of the church.

We often speak about our church family, and in the absence of a full-time minister, it has been wonderful to see so many people coming together to share their gifts, whether in leading worship, prayer, hospitality, friendship, or in a multitude of different ways. We are the church together!

In the book of Exodus, Moses receives some sound advice from Jethro, his Father in Law, who has seen him surrounded by his people from morning until night, trying to sort out their problems:

What you are doing is not good. You and the people with you will certainly wear yourselves out, for the thing is too heavy for you. You are not able to do it alone. (Exodus 18:17-18)

As we begin to look for a new minister to replace John, it is worth remembering Jethro's words. We are looking for a leader, but they can't be the church on their own. Each one of us has a role to play, each one of us has something we can bring.

Over the course of this year, together with our friends in South East Edinburgh Church of Scotland, we are going to be embarking on a stewardship campaign which will encourage each of us to think about what we might be able to do to support the work and mission of the church. Please pray about this and keep an eye out for further details in due course.

The first step in our search for a new minister will come on 27th May, when David Clarkson, our Interim Moderator, will attend the meeting of the SEECOS United Kirk Session.

After David has met Kirk Session, we will be in a position to begin to plan for appointing a Nominating Committee. In addition to Liberton Kirk members, this will include representatives from the other SEECOS churches.

The Nominating committee is supported by a Vacancy Advisory Committee from Presbytery. David will be worshipping with us on Sunday 31 August at our Covenant Service, which will be a good opportunity to begin to get to know each other better.

I look forward to sharing further details of the vacancy process as soon as they are available.

Over the summer months, our worship will continue to be led by a team of familiar faces drawn from our church family.

If you have any questions about pastoral care, please speak to Linda Wright. Alastair Cameron will be happy to receive any requests for prayer and news of answered prayer. If you have any queries about general church business, please contact me.

Sunday 20 April 2025 will be remembered as a very special day in the history of Liberton Kirk. Having been in denial ever since John first announced his intention to demit as Minister of Liberton Kirk and Moderator of the Kirk Session of South East Edinburgh Church of Scotland, this Easter Sunday was the day we were able to thank John and Lindsay for all they have done for our church family and for the community in Liberton over the last 28 years.



The inspiring worship of the Easter services was followed by perhaps the largest ever gathering in the Kirk Centre for a delicious buffet lunch and fond farewells to John and Lindsay. Knowing how much the manse garden and greenhouse have meant to them, we hope that John and Lindsay will be able to use at least some of the collection which was presented to them to

purchase a greenhouse for their new garden. They also received a vine which we hope will thrive and produce many grapes over the years ahead, a fitting symbol for the legacy they have left behind in the family of Liberton Kirk.

Lindsay received a beautiful floral arrangement and a special pair of earrings made for her in the form of the Liberton Cross. The symbol was taken from an ancient Celtic carved stone found in the area and now on display in the National Museum of Scotland.



We hope that John and Lindsay will enjoy reminiscing as they look through the photo book they received with images from their more than 28 years in Liberton and read the many personal memories and words of thanks which went into their memory book.

The presentations were accompanied by a Pakistani psalm setting, well known to them from their earlier life and by a special tribute to the tune of Old MacDonald Had a Farm!

Today's the day when we must say a fond farewell to John. Though Liberton Kirk won't be the same, we must carry on.

For 28 years John's been with us,

Leading, caring, through the good and bad times. He's a special minister, our much-loved John.

That wasn't the end though! We were delighted to be able to see John and Lindsay again the following Friday for their farewell cèilidh with music provided by Keith Dickson. It was lovely to see not just members of Liberton Kirk, but also many from the wider family of SEECOS and the local community. We were privileged that John and his friends agreed to provide the interval act and shared some of their favourite songs, including the Song of Liberton, written by John himself:

Singing with the old folks on a Thursday afternoon, Singing with the Sunday morning crowds, O the song of Liberton, you'll always be a friend to me.

John's photograph has now been added to the gallery in the Elders' Room of ministers of Liberton Kirk, 8 ministries covering a period of more than 190 years in the life of our church family. Thank you to John and Lindsay for everything they have done during their time with us. Thank you to everyone who contributed in so many different ways to making their send-off very special.

And beating, beating upon it?



Stepping out for Charity



How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? Romans 10 verse 14

During 2025 we are looking daily at the theme of ITS ALL ABOUT JESUS. So far we have considered some of the things He did and said and how the Early Church followed His teachings. We pause at our times of Midday Devotion to pray for others in our church family, our city and our world. In August we continue July's journey with Paul through Romans as we consider the truths behind the words IN CHRIST JESUS.



We are all invited to listen for God's voice and journey together daily in our 'rhythm of devotion' in 2025.

These Devotions are but one way to feed on God's Word in the morning, at midday, in the evening to pray with Him continually through the day and even to share with others the treasures or hurdles you discover.

A Mission Trip to Rwanda in 2026

Most of you will know that one of our Mission Partners is Comfort International, Cumbernauld who we have worked with for some four years. Callum Henderson, the CEO, visited our church on Mission Sunday, January 2024 and gave an excellent account of the work carried out by his organisation.

Since CI started, over 25 years ago now, they operate in 5 central African countries, Rwanda, Burundi, South Sudan, DR Congo and Uganda

To read what is involved in the various countries and projects supported by Comfort International go to https://comfortinternational.org/

We are hoping to make a visit to Rwanda, and to take a full team we will need a minimum 10 visitors, 12 would be better because travel when we are in country will be by mini-bus.

The advantages of taking a full team from Liberton are:

- Visits to the various projects can be co-ordinated
- We will be helped by several of the in-country partners used by CI
- Security is always enhanced if we travel as the one group
- Meeting the various children projects is always more exciting if we are presenting a single church.

Kigali, the capital of Rwanda, is perhaps not different to any big bustling city with lots to get us excited but we will get to know the "real" Rwanda when we visit the communities in the outlying areas. You will meet 100's of children, 10's of communities, church communities and a very full programme of activities.

Despite the history of the genocide, Rwanda is very safe. Visits to out-lying communities will be without incident. The hardest thing you might be asked



to do is water crops, help dig a ditch, play exhausting games with the kids we help support through sponsorship.



Our accommodation will be at Good News International Guest House run by one of CI's partners in country, in very comfortable guest houses with en-suite toilet facilities in each room.

Here are some ideas for what we can do during our visit:

* Street Kid Projects: There are three separate street kid projects in Kigali right now. It's always a treat to visit and play with the kids at their adopted homes. Just be prepared to play skipping games, with parachutes - they're always running around!





- * Babies and Mums Project: This project will give us the chance to meet the moms we support. There are always moms who need our help because of the circumstances they're in. Please bring a suitcase full of baby clothes.
- * Communities Healing from the Pain of Genocide: Ben Kayuma, the founder of Good News International, always makes sure we have a chance to talk to and listen to the stories of communities that are still working to heal the divisions caused by the genocide in 1992. This is usually followed by a visit to the National Genocide Centre in Kigali, a must-see for anyone visiting Rwanda for the first

time.

- * Visit to Lake Kivu: This depends on the current situation with security and the DR Congo. If our schedules allow, we might get a half-day off to swim in Lake Kivu and visit "Bat" island by boat. If you're a keen swimmer, you're welcome to join Callum for an early morning swim.
- * Feeding Projects: There are still children going hungry across Africa. In Bisesero, Rwanda, many families can't afford to pay for school meals for their children. When we visit the street kids, we'll take the opportunity to serve them one of the main meals of the day.

Whatever is on the schedule you can be sure worship and singing will be part of what we do.


