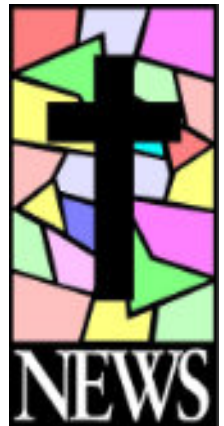
Judy Weston

I'm not drunk! I was just pouring out how I feel to God.



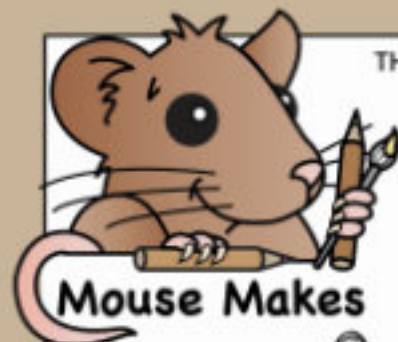
Back home, Hannah had a son, and she named him Samuel.

this displeased Samuel; so he prayed to the Lord. 1 Sam 8:6*

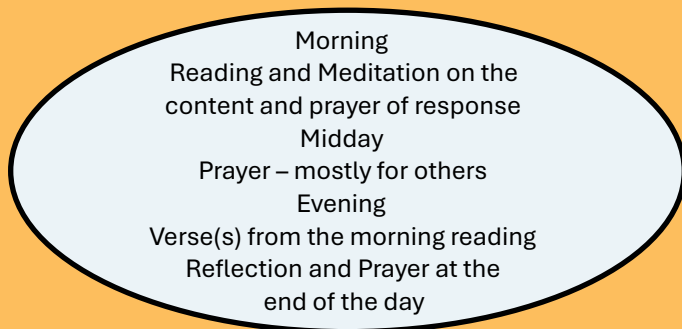
During 2026 we are looking daily at the theme of DAVID – GODLY WARRIOR KING. So far this new year we have considered some of the PSALMS and this month we begin the story of David himself, digging into 1 SAMUEL. We pause at our times of Midday Devotion to pray for others in our church family, our city and our world.

We are all invited to listen for God’s voice and make our response as we journey together daily in our ‘rhythm of devotion’ in 2026



These Devotions are but one way to feed on God’s Word in the morning, at midday, in the evening to pray with Him continually through the day and even to share with others the treasures or hurdles you discover.

The Church website and Facebook page (even on a handy mobile) provide a fuller daily devotional page. However it all follows the pattern below into which the information provided fits, based on the Kirk’s origins of the Celtic and Northumbrian traditions which we started as a church family in 2015. We pause at our times of Midday Devotion to pray for others in our church family, our city and our world.

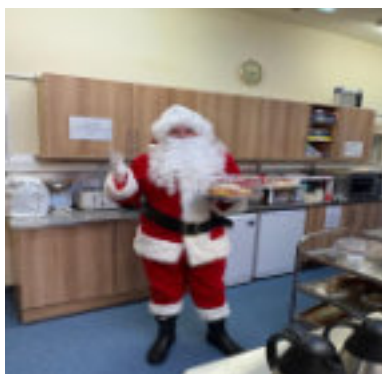
Kirkgate Café News

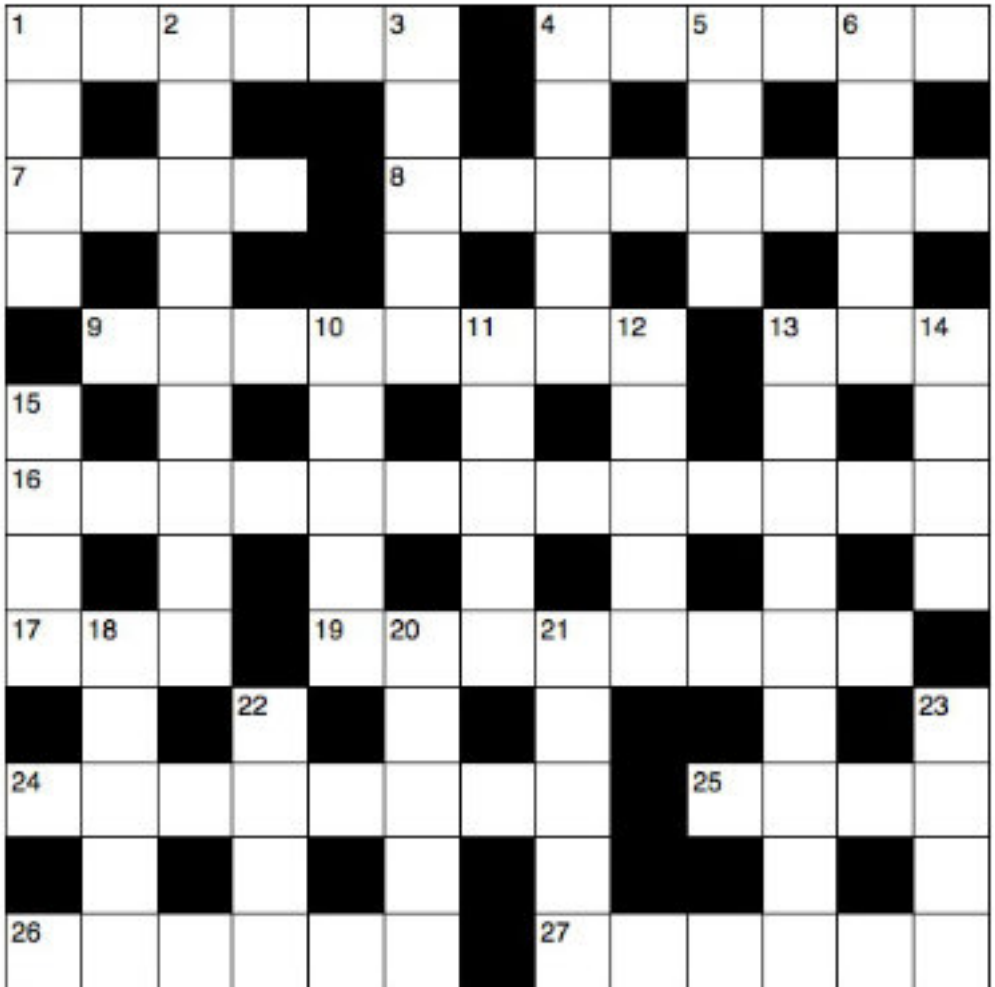
