

PALM SUNDAY TO EASTER

Please come and take part in some of the wonderful services and events in this most important week in church life.

PALM SUNDAY (29th March) (N.B. Clocks go forward 1 hour at 2am)

On the Sunday before Easter there is **joint evening worship** (Big Idea Churches) at 7pm in Liberton Kirk Centre. The speaker is Rev. Ken Brown, Mission Co-ordinator for the Presbytery of Edinburgh and West Lothian.



HOLY WEEK EVENTS



The first joint SEECAT event is a **Passover Meal on Monday 30th March**, 7pm in St. Catherine's Church Hall, Gracemount Drive. We remember Jesus celebrating the Passover with his disciples just before his death, and the history behind it. Tickets are essential for this event as numbers are limited.

Then there's an ecumenical **Stations of the Cross Service on Wednesday 1st April**, 7.30pm in Liberton Northfield Church, Gilmerton Road. We follow the journey of Jesus towards the cross and it is a very moving service.

GOOD FRIDAY (3rd April)



The day begins for us outside Liberton Kirk at 10 o'clock, when we set off on a **Prayer Walk**, meeting up with Liberton Northfield and others at Liberton Northfield Church and then walking down Gilmerton Road to Morrisons. On the walk we stop at various points where people gather (schools, residential homes etc.) to pray for our community. In the car park at Morrisons at 11 o'clock SEECAT holds an **Open-air Service**. We are joined for this by others who have walked from Moredun and from Gracemount and by others not able to do the walk but wanting to be part of the service. Morrisons is good for after-service refreshments!

On Good Friday afternoon there is a **Joint Service at Gracemount High School** at 3 pm, when all the SEECAT churches meet again, remembering just what the cross means for us all. There will be a cup of tea and hot cross buns after the service, which gives us a chance to chat with people from the other churches we don't see very often.

If you are unable to be at either of these events, there will be a **Service of Worship and Reflection** at 7.30pm in Liberton Kirk.

EASTER DAY (5th April)

Our first chance to celebrate Jesus' rising is the 6.30am **Dawn Worship** at the Braid Hills Trig Point (meet at 6am at the Golf Driving Range).

Then in church we have a traditional **morning service** at 9.30am and a **family service** for all ages at 11am. Bring a daffodil to decorate the cross at both.
